

Congregation Notes Passover Day 7
"Prophecy Pointing to Revelation in the Crossing of the Red Sea"
Exodus 13:17-15:26; 2 Samuel 22:1-15; John 20:1-14
April 19,2025; Nisan 21, 5785

- *2 Corinthians 3:17-18 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the <u>Spirit of the Lord is</u>, there is freedom. And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the glory of the Lord, <u>are being transformed into His image with intensifying glory</u>, which <u>comes from the Lord</u>, <u>who is the Spirit....</u>
- *Exodus 21:2 If you buy a Hebrew servant, he shall serve six years; and in the seventh he shall go out free and pay nothing.
- *Exodus 6:6-7 Therefore say to the children of Israel: 'I am the LORD; I will bring you out (SALVATION) from under the burdens of the Egyptians, I will rescue you from their bondage, and I will redeem with an outstretched arm and with great judgments. I will take you as My people, and I will be your God.
- *John 8:32-36 and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free. They answered Him, We are Abraham's descendants and have never yet been enslaved to anyone; how is it that You say, You will become free? Yeshua answered them, Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is the slave of sin.
- The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son does remain forever. <u>So if the Son makes you free</u>, you will be free indeed.
- *1 Corinthians 10:31 So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God.
- *John 6:33—35 For the <u>bread of God</u> is <u>He who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world</u>. Sir, they said, Give us this bread at all times. Yeshua answered, <u>I am the bread of life</u>. Whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst.
- *Philippians 4:8 Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.
- *Isaiah 26:3 You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you.

- *Romans 8:6 The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace.
- *Romans 12:2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but <u>be transformed by the renewing of your mind</u>. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.
- *Colossians 3:2 Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth.
- *Matthew 26:26 Now as they were eating, <u>Yeshua took bread</u>, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body."
- *Isaiah 30:20 And though the Lord give you the bread of adversity and the water of affliction, yet your Teacher will not hide himself anymore, but your eyes shall see your Teacher.
- *2 Timothy 2:3-4 You therefore must endure hardship <u>as a good soldier</u> of Yeshua the Messiah. <u>No one engaged in warfare entangles himself with the affairs of this life</u>, that he may please him who enlisted him as a soldier.
- *Exodus 13:17-18 Then it came to pass, when Pharaoh had let the people go, that <u>God did</u>
 not lead them by way of the land of the Philistines, although that was near; for God said,
 Lest perhaps the people change their minds when they see war, and return to Egypt.
 So God led the people around by way of the wilderness of the Red Sea. And the <u>children of</u>
 Israel went up in orderly ranks out of the land of Egypt.
- *Amos 1:6 The LORD said: I will punish Philistia for countless crimes, and I won't change my mind. They dragged off my people from town after town to sell them as slaves to the Edomites.
- *Psalm 83:7 of Gebal, Ammon, and Amalek, of Philistia with the people of Tyre.
- *Amos 1:8-10 I will cut off the ruler of Ashdod and the one who wields the scepter in Ashkelon. I will turn My hand against Ekron, and the remnant of the Philistines will perish," says the Lord GOD. This is what the LORD says: For three transgressions of Tyre, even four, I will not revoke My judgment, because they delivered up a whole congregation of exiles to Edom and broke a covenant of brotherhood. So I will send fire upon the walls of Tyre and consume its citadels.
- *Joel 3:19 Egypt shall become a desolation and <u>Edom a desolate wilderness</u>, for the violence done to the people of Judah, because they have shed innocent blood in their land.
- *Ezekiel 25:12-14 "Thus says the LORD God: Because <u>Edom acted revengefully against the house of Judah and has grievously offended in taking vengeance on them</u>, therefore thus

- says the Lord God, I will stretch out my hand against Edom and cut off from it man and beast. And I will make it desolate; from Teman even to Dedan they shall fall by the sword. And I will lay my vengeance upon Edom by the hand of my people Israel, and they shall do in Edom according to my anger and according to my wrath, and they shall know my vengeance, declares the Lord God.
- *Numbers 21:4 They traveled from Mount Hor by the way to the Red Sea, to compass the land of Edom: and the soul of the people was much discouraged because of the way.
- *Numbers 21:5The people <u>spoke against God</u>, and against Moses, Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For <u>there is no bread</u>, and there is no water; and our soul loathes this light worthless קלקל bread.
- *Isaiah 2:17-18 The <u>pride of man will be humbled</u> and the loftiness of men will be abased; and the LORD alone will be exalted in that day, but the idols will completely vanish.
- *Numbers 22:23 Now the <u>donkey saw</u> the Angel of the LORD standing in the way with His drawn sword in His hand, and the <u>donkey turned aside out of the way</u> and went into the field. So Balaam struck the donkey to turn her back onto the road.
- *2 Peter 2:15-16 They have left the straight way and wandered off to follow the way of Balaam son of Beor, who loved the wages of wickedness. / <u>But he was rebuked for his transgression by a donkey</u>, otherwise without speech, that spoke with a man's voice and restrained the prophet's madness.
- *Psalm 2:1-4 Why do the nations rage, <u>And the people plot a vain thing</u>? The kings of the earth set themselves, And the rulers take counsel together, Against the LORD and against His Anointed, saying, Let us break Their bonds in pieces And cast away Their cords from us. <u>He</u> who sits in the heavens shall laugh; The LORD shall hold them in derision.
- *Exodus 14:1-7 Now the LORD spoke to Moses, saying: Speak to the children of Israel, that they turn and camp before Pi Hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea, opposite Baal Zephon; you shall camp before it by the sea. For Pharaoh will say of the children of Israel,

 They are bewildered by the land; the wilderness has closed them in. Then I will harden Pharaoh's heart, so that he will pursue them; and I will gain honor over Pharaoh and over all his army, that the Egyptians may know that I am the LORD. And they did so.
- *Exodus 14:5-8 Now it was told the king of Egypt that the people had fled, and the heart of Pharaoh and his servants was turned against the people; and they said, Why have we done this, that we have let Israel go from serving us? So he made ready his chariot and took his people with him. Also, he took six hundred choice chariots, and all the chariots of Egypt with captains

<u>over every one of them</u>. And the LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh king of Egypt, and he pursued the children of Israel; and the children of Israel went out with boldness.

- *Exodus 14:10b-12 So they were very afraid, and the children of Israel cried out to the LORD. Then they said to Moses, Because there were no graves in Egypt, have you taken us away to die in the wilderness? Why have you so dealt with us, to bring us up out of Egypt? Is this not the word that we told you in Egypt, saying, Let us alone that we may serve the Egyptians? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than that we should die in the wilderness.
- *Exodus 14:14 HaShem will wage יַלְהֶבּ war for you, and you shall remain silent.
- *Exodus 14:15-16 And the LORD said to Moses, Why do you cry to Me? <u>Tell the children of Israel to go forward</u>. But lift up your rod, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it. And the children of Israel shall go on dry ground through the midst of the sea.
- *Exodus 14:18 Then the <u>Egyptians shall know</u> that I am the Lord, when <u>I have gained honor</u> for Myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his horsemen.
- *Revelation 16:10-11 And the fifth angel poured out his bowl on the throne of the beast, and its kingdom was plunged into darkness, and men began to gnaw their tongues in anguish and they blasphemed the God of heaven on account of their distresses, and on account of their sores; and they did not repent of their deeds.
- *Exodus 14:21 Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea and the LORD caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry ground, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. And the Egyptians pursued and went after them into the midst of the sea, all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen.
- *Exodus 14:24-25a Now it came to pass, in the morning watch, that the Lord looked down upon the army of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and cloud, and He troubled the army of the Egyptians. And <u>He took off their chariot wheels</u>, so that they drove them with difficulty;...
- *Exodus 14:26-29 Then the LORD said to Moses, Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the waters may come back upon the Egyptians, on their chariots, and on their horsemen. And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and when the morning appeared, the sea returned to its full depth, while the Egyptians were fleeing into it. So the LORD overthrew the Egyptians in the midst of the sea. Then the waters returned and covered the chariots, the horsemen, and all the army of Pharaoh that came into the sea after them. Not so

much as one of them remained. But the children of Israel had walked on dry land in the midst of the sea, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left.

*Exodus 15:1-6 Then Moses and the children of Israel sang this song to the LORD, and spoke, saying: I will sing to the LORD, For He has triumphed gloriously! The horse and its rider He has thrown into the sea! The LORD is my strength and song, And He has become my salvation; He is my God, and I will praise Him; My father's God, and I will exalt Him. The LORD is a man of war; The LORD is His name. Pharaoh's chariots and his army He has cast into the sea; His chosen captains also are drowned in the Red Sea. The depths have covered them; They sank to the bottom like a stone. Your right hand, O LORD, has become glorious in power; Your right hand, O LORD, has dashed the enemy in pieces.

*Revelation 15:3 And they sang the song of Moses, the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvelous are Your works, O Lord God, the Almighty; Righteous and true are Your ways, King of the saints! Who shall not fear You, O Lord, and glorify Your name? For You alone are holy. For all nations shall come and worship before You.
